Welcome back to everyone for the start of a new academic year.

As the new Headteacher of Sir Fredric Osborn School I am delighted to open this first edition of Insight for the academic year. I am also proud to acknowledge the fantastic set of examination results for our students. Key performance measures are improved for GCSE and A level results.

For GCSE, the school has achieved a significant improvement in its key performance measure for 5 GCSE A*-C passes including English and Maths. The school has achieved a 49% pass rate which is significantly better than the previous year. High achievers included Joshua Aylott, Chloe Garoghan, Tara Pooley-Green, Tosin Sowemimo and Matthew Westcott, who all achieved A* and A grades in seven or more of their subjects. Special mention must be extended to Charley Holloway-Biddle who achieved six A* and five A grades.

It is right to celebrate these individual achievements, we are equally proud of the achievements of **all** our students, particularly the ones who improved on their target grades. Though their grades may appear to be modest in comparison with the students above, they still signify phenomenal progress. Huw Christianson achieved 10 A*-C with 9 subjects being above his challenging target grades.

It has been an outstanding year for A Level students at Sir Fredric Osborn School with our average points score for each student increasing by 46 points to 662. This means on average a student achieved a C grade in 2015 compared to D+ in 2014. We are proud of every student who has achieved their potential, whatever the grade they achieved. However special mention must go to Daniel Kirk who has achieved A in Maths and Physics and a B in Further Maths. He is now attending the University of York reading Theoretical Physics.

A very special welcome is extended to our new Year 7s who joined us last week, they are arriving at a point where Sir Fredric Osborn School can declare itself an improving school. I would like to thank them for looking so smart around the school and for settling in so quickly and sensibly. They have made an excellent start but they have a lot to live up to! Let's hope that the rest of the year brings similar good news and that as a whole community we can continue to make Sir Fredric Osborn School the best possible environment for our children to thrive and progress.

School Communications

To keep your child/ren safe and ensure their well-being, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our links with you and keep everyone up-to-date and well informed. As sending written information home is sometimes unreliable; we have decided to implement Schoolcomms, an electronic school communication system. This will enable you to receive all your information from school quickly and reliably. We can send letters by email to your inbox and short messages directly to your mobile phone as a text message, or if you have an Apple or Android mobile phone, by app message.

You will:

- Receive letters more reliably and promptly
- See letters in your inbox like any other email
- Get a short text or app message if we need to contact you urgently
- Still get paper letters if you don't have email
- No need to rely on your child for delivery
- Be able to reply by email, text or app message, and be able to send us any reasons for absence via text, email or app message



We can:

- Send more letters and information
- Save money on admin time, printing and paper
- Contact you urgently when necessary

Next steps:

- The school will use the email address and mobile number that we hold for the Priority one contact(s). If you are not certain that we have your correct details, please use the reply slip provided
- If you do not have an Apple or Android device, skip to step 6**
- Go to your app store and search for "School Gateway" and download the app
- Once downloaded, select the "I'm a New User" button; enter your email address and mobile number that we have on record for you. Select Send PIN and a PIN number will be text to your mobile phone
- Log in with your email address and the PIN, your account is now active and you will receive instant notifications of messages in your notifications bar.
- If you change your contact details please let the school know as soon as possible
