If you know of anyone who was not able to make the Open Evening or Mornings, please just ask them to contact the school to arrange a convenient time to visit.

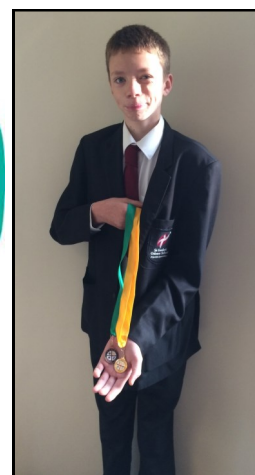

Attendance & Attainment

We want your child's life to be a success! We do not want your child to fail! We are sure that as a parent you want exactly the same things for your child. How can we work together and make it happen?

- Children should come to school every day. Our school's attendance target is 96% but children should always aim for 100%
- We WANT children to learn so that they have the opportunity to go to college or university, take up an apprenticeship/training and find a good job.
- If your child is not in school, missing odd days he/she is falling behind and it's harder to catch up with school work.
- If your child is genuinely ill please provide the school with a note so that the absence can be authorised. Please ensure you ring the school in the morning to inform us of the absence.
- Please try wherever possible to book medical appointments outside of school hours. If the appointment has to be during the school day please send your child to school before and after the appointment where possible.
- If you are having problems getting your child to school please talk to us.
- If your child takes one day off every week, at the end of the school year it will give a total of nearly 8 weeks off school!

Alongside attendance is punctuality. It is imperative that your child is punctual to school. Registration in the morning is 8.30am therefore your child needs to be lined up outside their Form Room at 8.30am and not arriving to school at this time. The back gate will be locked at 8.30am every morning; if your child uses this entrance please ensure that they leave for school in plenty of time so they arrive before the gates are locked.

We travelled to the famous Hackney Marshes for this second round game, having been fortunate enough to secure a tri from the first round. The boys took an audible intake of breath when they saw the sheer scale of Hackney Marshes itself, but were pleased with the condition of the pitches – very much suited to a short-passing style game.
